Calling All Workout Warriors

The NFL Combine '06 begins the Olympic phase of college football scouting with the annual event in Indianapolis. Players have worked diligently preparing for this week long event knowing that a strong performance here can enhance their NFL Draft status significantly. These workouts have misled NFL talent evaluators with speed usually the factor that scouts become mesmerized with when they make their final reports. This year will be no different. Watch for players like TE Vernon Davis, LB Thomas Howard, CB Tye Hill and Charles Gordon, WR Sinorice Moss, Devin Hester and Jeremy Bloom (a current Olympic sky performer) to put up incredible numbers especially in the speed events. Whether that translates to the playing field remains to be seen, but expect them to be the focus of the news during the busy week at the RCA Dome.

The NFL Combine '06 will be televised for the second time by the NFL Network channel next week. Over 330 college players and over 600 NFL front office personnel will attend the six day event. Players will go through extensive testing, athletically, intellectually and psychologically by the 32 staffs of each NFL club. Extensive front office personnel including GMs, coaches, scouts and medical personnel represented each NFL team. Each club will be limited to 15 minute interviews with a maximum of 62 players (increased from 60 three years ago with new underclassmen) over the six day event. NFL Draft '06 prospects will be put through a series of tests both physical and mental in the biggest sports job market in the business. Once again, numerous prospects are expected to avoid the workout, opting for

the friendly confines of their school's track on a pro day in March or April. The NFL Combine gives players a chance to impress pro scouts on a level playing field vs all competitors. The surface at the RCA Dome has proven faster than expected in recent years after a reputation of being a notoriously slow surface thru the '90s. The surface had been rated one of the two worst in the NFL before being replaced after the combine workouts last winter. Many of the prospects that opt out of the sprints will be offensive skill position players who will run later in the spring. Most fear a poor time will push them down significantly at their positional rankings. The individual workouts can give a player an unfair advantage over players who run at Indy with much faster home turf. Tracks at Tennessee, Ohio St., Syracuse, Florida St. among others are lightning quick with many 4.4 times. NFL scouts cannot make all of these workouts and the delays can backfire on the players with a smaller audience to showcase their talents. With workouts extended right up to the NFL Draft, the information process forces clubs to prepared for not only more travel, but also factoring the new data into their value board. Times have been one of the most debatable measuring sticks in the evaluation process. Clubs have allowed times to affect a players final ranking dramatically and can be totally misled by the speed if it does not verify performance on the football field during the fall. Two former NFL players Jerry Rice and Marcus Allen were performers who did not burn up the running tracks during workouts but neither player was caught from behind often as pro stars. Both were two of the best scorers among other qualities in NFL history. Times can work both ways though, with clubs running away from poor numbers like three years ago when wideout Antwan Boldin ran a disappointing 4.72 forty. He went on to set numerous records as a rookie receiver in '03 after being selected by the Cardinals who did not shy away from him off the workout when they selected him surprisingly in the 2nd round.

Senior Bowl '06 All-Star Game - Mobile, Alabama

In last spring's NFL Draft '05, 83 players who participated in the Senior Bowl '05 were drafted over the seven rounds. Ten players were selected in the first round from that game.

Game and Practices - Monday Jan. 23rd to game on Jan. 28th

QB Brodie Croyle of Alabama displayed a live arm and mobility in the pocket. He also showed good footwork and ball handling, in addition to fine overall mechanics and leadership ability under center. **QB Jay Cutler of Vanderbilt** moved well in the pocket and was accurate throwing on the move. He took charge in the pocket and showed a good live arm in the passing drills with sound decision making. Those two passers had an impressive week in practices that elevated their stock significantly. **QB Michael Robinson of Penn State** showed good athleticism with a nice arm and the mobility to be dangerous as a runner. He had a fine game as a runner with limited throws from the pocket. **RB DeAngelo Williams of Memphis** had a fine week of practices and hit the hole with authority and the quick cutting skills to change directions at top speed. He also showed the ability to cut back and find the opening to make plays. His blocking needs development. **RB Joseph Addai of LSU** showed a burst to the hole with nice cutting skills. He struggled catching the ball during the practices. **RB Jerious Norwood of Mississippi St** was quick to the hole and showed the ability to make the proper running decisions. He displayed reliable hands, in addition to some kickoff return skills. **RB Jerome Harrison of Washington St** was quick to the hole and displayed fine cutting skills. He combined both speed and power and displayed natural running skills. He needs work on catching the ball out of the backfield. **FB Lawrence Vickers of Colorado** displayed fine hands and ran precise routes as a receiver. He showed well developed blocking and receiving skills. **WR Anthony Mix of Auburn** was strong getting off the line and showed the ability to go over the middle and make the tough catch. He lacks the speed to separate in the deep game, but displayed reliable hands over the week. **WR Devin Aromashodu of Auburn** showed fine speed and leaping skills. He also showed good route running and the sure hands and fine body control. He completed the week with a TD in the game. **WR Hank Baskett of New Mexico** made a strong impression as a possession receiver. He got off the line and displayed decent separation and cutting skills in his patterns. He caught the ball fairly well and is an athlete with upside. **WR Skyler Green of LSU** displayed a burst to get deep and adjust to the ball in flight. He showed fine hands and the ability to run after the catch, in addition to his top return skills. **WR Ben Obomanu of Auburn** showed a burst off the line, fine body control and reliable hands. He is a prospect who continues to improve. **WR Derek Hagan of Arizona St** had an erratic performance over the practices and game. He was quick into his routes and displayed fine body control, but he had inconsistent hands catching the ball. **TE Garrett Mills of Tulsa** displayed fine hands and the ability to run after the catch. **TE Marcedes Lewis of UCLA** was fluid off the line and ran good routes and showed well developed receiving skills. **OL Cody Douglas of Tennessee** displayed adequate footwork and the ability to bend his knees, anchor and drive block. **OL Ryan Cook of New Mexico** showed nice mobility and quickness on the snap. He needs to be more physical to get consistent movement at the point of attack. He displayed the versatility to play inside and tackle. **OT Jonathan Scott of Texas** did a good job in pass protection, showing the ability to setup quickly and get his hands on an opponent. He lacked a strong push as a drive blocker. **OT Albert Toeaina of Tennessee** was physical once he locked on to a defender. He played with better quickness and mobility with the loss of weight since the season ended being the key reason. **OL Mike Degory of Florida** displayed fine footwork with the ability to adjust easily to either side. He improved over the course of the week.

DE Mathias Kiwanuka of Boston College displayed nice quickness and strength with the instincts to rush the passer. He injured his shoulder during the practices that limited his action late in the week and during the game. **DT Babatunde Oshinowo of Stanford** showed power and quickness on the inside, but needs work on his technique to get off blockers better. **DT Dusty Dvoracek of Oklahoma** displayed power on the inside, but needs work on his hand use and improve his secondary moves and play recognition. **DE Victor Adeyanju of Indiana** was quick off the edge to be effective as a pass rusher. He held up well in run support. He was quick off the ball and showed fine athleticism and improved his stock nicely. **DE Mark Anderson of Alabama** displayed fine speed off the edge and good football instincts. He had a good week and was impressive during the practices. During the game, he beat OT

D'Brickshaw Ferguson who will probably be selected in the top five selections in April. **LB Freddie Roach of Alabama** was impressive and showed the ability to fill the hole and the speed to get to sidelines. **LB Spencer Havner of UCLA** lined up at both outside spots and performed well. He filled the hole quickly and made sure tackles, in addition to fine coverage skills. **LB Thomas Howard of UTEP** was very fluid in coverage and displayed fine speed, mobility and good change of direction skills. **LB Gerris Wilkinson of Georgia Tech** ran well and showed up physically in run support. He got to the ball, but was stiff and struggled when asked to change directions. **LB Travis Williams of Auburn** diagnosed plays well and showed good speed in pursuit. He struggled at the point of attack but dropped easily in pass coverage. **CB DeMario Minter of Georgia** displayed fine footwork and his basic technique was very good in coverage along with strong tackling skills. He displayed good ball skills. **FS Anthony Smith of Syracuse** displayed good range and instincts with the speed to cover the field. **CB Tim Jennings of Georgia** was quick to react to the ball and pass patterns. He struggled getting off blocks. **CB Cedric Griffin of Texas** reacted well to pass patterns and made a key interception in the game. QB Brett Basanez of Northwestern had a fine week of practice. His accuracy improved over the week and he almost took his team to a big comeback win only to fall a yard short at the end of the game. After coming off a solid week at the Las Vegas Bowl, his stock should rise once scouts break down further film. **QB Reggie McNeal of Texas A&M** had a strong game that included some late game heroics. He has a good arm and fine mobility to develop into a good NFL starter. **QB Bruce Gradkowski of Toledo** was very accurate and showed good decision making. He helped his cause with a solid week. **QB Tarvaris Jackson of Alabama St.** struggled with accuracy and lacked good velocity on his passes. He threw into heavy coverage often and needs time to absorb a more sophisticated offense at the next level. He needs work on his footwork to setup better that should improve his accuracy over time. **RB De'Arrius Howard of Arkansas** scored 3 TDs. He ran hard, showing the ability to break tackles and find openings. **Texas Tech RB Taurean Henderson** showed a good understanding of the passing game. He displayed fine cutting skills with good balance and a low quick running style. **RB Cory Ross of Nebraska** shows a quick burst through the hole with fine functional strength to get the most of each rushing attempt. **RB Leon Washington of Florida St** displayed a quick burst thru the hole. He ran well and displayed good lateral quickness. He also displayed sure hands as a receiver over the practices. **TE David Thomas** displayed fine hands and the ability to find soft spots against zone coverage. As an inline blocker, he failed to get a strong push on most defensive linemen and needs lower body strength work. **San Diego**

St. wideout Jeff Webb shows the speed to get down the field nicely with a good initial burst off the line. He has good acceleration with the ability to separate deep. He needs to work on his route running and going over the middle. **BYU's wideout Todd Watkins** showed sure hands with the speed to get deep. He displayed a burst to get deep and good run after the catch ability. He impressed over the week and made a smooth adjustment to a ball in flight. **Wisconsin receiver Brandon Williams** had a good week catching the ball. He has the burst to separate and fine run after the catch ability. He showed the ability to track the ball and make a play on it. He rates as a fine slot receiver with a nice level of development. **WR Jonathan Orr of Wisconsin** has the package NFL scouts seek in a prospect, but his level of development is a concern. His route running needs refinement. **Hofstra wideout Marques Colston** is a fine looking athlete with size and agility. He has a big frame and all the tools of a possession receiver. He gets off the line well with the ability to retain his speed in his cuts. He made a great catch to end the game that fell one yard short of a win. **Texas A&M wideout Jason Carter** had a good week of practices, showing top speed and quickness in his routes. He ran good routes and caught the ball well with the ability to get to top speed and run after the catch. He has the separation speed to get deep and make the big play. **WR Mike Hass of Oregon St** ran fine routes and adjusted well to the ball. He displayed sure hands and the toughness to go over the middle and hold on to the ball. **TE Cooper Wallace** ran hard after the catch, showing fine power to break tackles, in addition to sure hands as a receiver. He has the athleticism and toughness to block and compete for a starting job, though his lack of speed will push him down the charts. **Oregon TE Tim Day** has excellent body control and very good hands. He is more developed as a receiver than as an inline blocker. **Texas Tech OT E.J. Whitley** showed good footwork and the ability to slide in pass protection. He needs technique work as a drive blocker and must learn to bend his knees more consistently. **OT/OG Kevin Boothe of Cornell** was very mobile and showed fine functional strength. He was a strong drive blocker and showed the nastiness to finish strong. **OT Joe Toledo of Washington** showed nice power and mobility. He lined mainly at right tackle and is an interesting prospect entering the workout stage of evaluation. **OG Rob Sims of Ohio St** got a strong push at the point of attack. He used his bulk well to stop bull pass rushers but needs work adjusting to secondary moves. He is an accomplished run blocker and comes off the ball with some pop to get strong movement.

DE James Wyche of Syracuse is a big athletic defender who combines power and speed and had a big week. He is a tall lean athlete who moves well and can be a force especially as a pass rusher when he plays with good leverage. He can struggle in run support at the point of attack and can be engulfed by bigger tackles. **DL Barry Cofield of Northwestern** lined up at both tackle and end. He needs to define his pro position to compete for a starting job. He had only an average effort over the week. **Auburn DT Tommy Jackson** was tough in run support, but struggled as a pass rusher and is strictly a run defender currently. **Georgia Tech DE Eric Henderson** was quick on the snap and showed the ability to get pressure off the edge. He had a fine week and helped his cause. He has good quickness plus the power and hand use to win many matchups. **DT Johnny Jolly of Texas A&M** got a good push in middle. He displayed power and quickness from the inside and helped his status. He could come on fast over the postseason. **Washington DT Manase Hopoi** showed good strength at the point of attack and uses his hands well. He has some ability to rush the passer, though he relies more on power than speed in that area. **Stanford LB Jon Alston** was quick to react and showed the speed to get to the sidelines and make tackles. He has the quickness to defeat the blocks showing fine agility, change of direction skills and range. **Stanford LB Kevin Schimmelman** displayed nice instincts, but only average athleticism. He can be a little stiff and upright which gives blockers a big target and hinders him in pass coverage. He had a fairly good effort in the game. **LB Trent Bray of Oregon St** displayed good instincts and sure tackling skills with the ability to get off and avoid tacklers. **LB Anthony Schlegel of Ohio St.** made a key fumble recovery He made plays, displaying good instincts and tackling ability especially between the tackles. He has the ability to blitz but needs development in his hand technique to separate from blockers better. **CB Quincy Butler of TCU** displayed adequate technique and the ability to make plays on the ball. He got a good break on the ball when he read the play properly. **CB Danieal Manning of Abilene Christian** displayed nice cover skills with good recovery speed and technique. He also showed the ability to break on the ball and make plays. **CB Dion Byrum of Ohio University** was quick in coverage and showed fine athleticism and technique. He has the quick reactions to make plays on the ball. He has the closing speed to match in man coverage. **Baylor safety Willie Andrews** worked at cornerback over the practices and played there for the first time in his career. He started exclusively at safety during his Baylor career. He shows the athleticism to make the conversion, but struggled during the game locating the ball and reading

routes on the outside. **DB Charlie Peprah of Alabama** also played some cornerback and showed enough ability there to get a long look on the outside in camp. He displays sure tackling skills and the ability to read plays. He closed quickly on the ball with the hitting power to separate receivers from the pass. **SS Josh Powell of San Jose St.** displayed strong hitting ability and the range and speed to go sideline to sideline. **FS Dwayne Slay of Texas Tech** was a big hitter and showed good coverage skills and the tackling ability to play the centerfield position. **SS Vickiel Vaughn of Arkansas** had a few big hits in both run support and coverage. He needs some development in defending the pass. but is a prospect with nice potential.

FB Adrian Byrd of New Mexico replaced **David Kirtman of USC** who was injured with a broken hand. **CB Gerrick McPhearson of Maryland** was injured with a hamstring pull. He was replaced by **CB Vernell Brown of Florida**.
