### ***NFL Draft '09 Buzz - Underclassmen Report:***

#### **Offensive Players**

QBs **Tim Tebow of Florida, Matthew Stafford of Georgia, Sam Bradford of Oklahoma, Tim LeFevour of Central Michigan and Nate Davis of Bowling Green** are all highly regarded underclassmen who would have a dramatic effect on the top rounds next spring if they declare for the NFL Draft '09 this January. Most of these passers will probably return for the '09 college season, though a few will be tempted to declare when given a very high draft projection this winter. **Matthew Stafford** is undecided and will wait until after his club's bowl game before deciding. He is a highly regarded passer with a very high first round grade currently. Ditto **Tim Tebow** who has indicated he will return for his senior season. **Bradford, LeFevour and Davis** are long shots to enter the NFL Draft '09, though if the top prospects return to school it could change their decisions in mid January. The weak senior class of QBs could be the final determining factor of all the underclassmen. Many prospects will seek advice from the NFL Advisory committee in December/January before considering whether to enter next spring's NFL Draft. The advisory committee gives each prospect an approximate indication to where he might go to assist them before making any final decision is made after the season.

**RB Chris Wells of Ohio St.** has been one of this season's more productive runners again and will most likely declare in January. He is a definite Top 15 prospect who could go in the top 10 selections. He combines rare size, power, toughness and speed. **RB Knowshon Moreno of Georgia** will seek advisory committee advice. He is a major playmaker with natural skills and the complete package to be a starting NFL feature back. He carries a first round grade at this point of his development. **RB DeMarco Murray of Oklahoma** is another big play specialist but probably limited to an early pro role performer if he enters this winter. He carries a high grade on his impact ability alone as both a runner and receiver. **RB LeSean McCoy of Pittsburgh** is having another huge performance. He has the compact frame that allows him to run with power and combined with his quickness and fine vision allows him to be one of the more honest runners in the nation. **RB C. J. Spiller of Clemson** is having a terrific performance despite missing a little time with a hamstring injury at midseason. He has the compact frame that allows him to run with power and combined with his quickness and fine speed allows him to be one of the nation's most explosive runners. **RB Shonn Greene of Iowa** may be the best back in the Big Ten this fall. He is giving serious consideration to declaring and could be one of the top backs off the board. He has natural running skills and shows the ability to consistently break tackles. **RB Keiland Williams of LSU** has had an inconsistent '08 season and has fallen in the rankings as a result. He is another natural runner with good receiving skills and could be one of the top backs when he is right. He may return to LSU to play next fall and live up to his potential. **RB P.J. Hill of Wisconsin** has been a fine power runner with the quickness to bounce outside. He is not a breakaway back and faces a difficult question this January. **RB Mike Goodson of Texas A&M** has flashed some playmaking ability with the speed to break a big play.

His production has been inconsistent though, and he needs further development to be ready for the pro game. **WR Michael Crabtree of Texas Tech** was been an impact weapon once again and one of the nation's premier performers. He has the complete package to be a top flight pro and is expected to decide to turn pro. His level of development is very high for such a young prospect. **WR Jerry Maclin of Missouri** has been an impact performer since early in his Big 12 career. He can be a difference maker as a pro, combining speed, quickness, power and running skills. He has intriguing skills for the NFL with big play ability as both a receiver and returner. **WR Darrius Heyward-Bey of Maryland** has had a monster performance that has been instrumental in the Maryland resurgence this season. He has imposing size with fine hands and the separation speed to get deep. **WR Percy Harvin of Florida** has been a difference maker in the SEC and a key reason why the Gators will challenge for the national title. He has explosive speed with natural running skills to be dangerous every time he touches the ball. He is expected to declare in January. **WR Kenny Britt of Rutgers** has been one of the hottest receivers in the nation since mid October. He will most likely opt to join the pro game now with a senior passer Mike Teel graduating. **WR Nakeem Nicks of North Carolina** continues to impress in the resurgence Tar Heel offense. He has flashed playmaking ability and has fine triangle numbers that has drawn heavy attention from NFL scouts. He has taken a big step up this fall but he would benefit from another season next fall. His imposing size and AA that rates him high, but he needs development in route running and defense recognition. **TE Jared Cook of South Carolina** has blue chip athleticism and he has shown production despite being limited due to average SC passers. He has intriguing upside potential as a pro. **TE Jermaine Gresham of Oklahoma** has been one of the most productive receivers at this position in years. He moves very well, catches everything and can run after the catch. He ranks the top tight end prospect in the nation regardless of class. **OT Andre Smith of Alabama** has excelled in the tough SEC, manning the left side in pass protection. He could be part of another fine tackle class. **OT Ciron Black of LSU** has been one of the more consistent performers in the SEC over the past two seasons. He moves well and delivers a wallop with his quick hands. **OT Russell Okung of Oklahoma St.** is another talented junior tackle. He has the package scouts seek in a left tackle prospect, though he is not fully developed. **OT John Jerry of Mississippi** had a strong '08 finish that could affect his decision to declare this January. He combines power and agility and could be one of the better tackles available from this class. **OG Greg Isdamer of West Virginia** is a tough physical underclassman. He combines great power as a drive blocker and has the athletic package to become a top guard prospect.

### Defensive Players

**DE Everett Brown of Florida St.** is a very quick edge pass rusher who can bend the corner and make the big play. He most likely enters the draft process. **DE George Selvie of South Florida** has been a fast edge rusher over his career, but is not having the same impact this fall that he had over the '07 season. He has the burst off the edge that allows him to gain a fast advantage as a pass rusher.

**DE Greg Hardy of Mississippi** is a rangy defender with intriguing upside potential despite a minor foot injury. He faces a key decision about declaring in January that may be determined by a few big late games. **DE Auston English of Oklahoma** has been a consistently strong front line defender until suffering a leg injury this fall. He has played well vs top competition with extensive experience with a highly development level. His injury most likely will bring him back for another season with the Sooners. **DE Greg Middleton of Indiana** has had a huge season. He is an explosive defender who recognizes plays and has the burst to the ball with the power to finish well and make sacks. He holds up well in the physical part of the game. **DT Terrence Cody of Alabama** has been a force from the inside and a prospect highly coveted especially from 3-4 defensive clubs. **LB Brandon Spikes of Florida** has come on strong over his junior season and ranks with any linebacker in the nation at this point. He stated earlier he would return to school for his final season but his strong finish will probably warrant him to entertain an answer from the advisory committee. He is a fine prospect who could light it up at an individual workout. He runs well and finishes strong and should be a top 50 prospect. **CB Vontae Davis of Illinois** will get info from NFL Advisory committee. He projects as a high first round talent currently and possibly a top ten selection. It is highly probable to turn pro in January despite only a good performance this fall. **CB Captain Munnerlyn of South Carolina** is a fine prospect but has had some inconsistent performances that leave questions about his level of development. He is lending toward declaring and will light it up at a workout especially in the 40 yard sprint. **CB D.J. Moore of Vanderbilt** has been a chief contributor to the

Vandy outstanding season. He has good ball skills and the hands to make the key interception. He is lending towards declaring in January and should be very impressive in any workouts. **CB Trevard Lindley of Kentucky** has had an inconsistent season. He is capable of big plays but can be slow to recognize routes and lose a step in the transition process. **FS Taylor Mays of USC** is an imposing athlete with excellent size, speed and instincts. He can also match in man situations and is a strong linebacker type defender near the line of scrimmage. He is lending toward to turning pro and potentially is a top 10-15 selection. **SS Myron Rolle of Florida St.** is a nice sized athlete with the ability to play either safety spot. He has corner type skills and moves easily to turn and run with receivers. He needs some play recognition development but he has the package to be a blue chip NFL prospect.

**1. \* Matthew Stafford - QB - Georgia**

Gifted junior QB has the talent to become a top flight NFL starter with development.

**2. \* Michael Crabtree - WR - Texas Tech**

Awesome third year wideout has the total package of size, hands, speed, smarts and toughness to become an impact NFL receiver.

**3. \* Andre Smith - OT - Alabama**

Huge junior left tackle has had an outstanding '08 season, combining the package of footwork, bulk, agility and strength to be a top pro prospect.

**4. Michael Oher - OT - Ole Miss**

Massive left tackle combines rare size, athleticism, agility and girth to be a very high selection. He should be one of the first overall selections from a strong offensive line class.

**5. \* Jeremy Maclin - WR - Missouri**

Big play wideout/ returner has been an impact performer in the Big 12, combining excellent running skills with the size and speed to break big plays regularly.

**6. \* Taylor Mays - FS - Southern Cal**

Imposing physical junior safety has the rare talent to be the next USC impact defender.

**7. Brian Orakpo - DE - Texas**

Fast edge pass rusher has the explosive burst off the edge to get after the passer and make a difference consistently.

**8. Eugene Monroe - OT - Virginia**

Nimble senior left tackle is a well developed prospect who combines top footwork, bulk and power to carry an early first round grade into the final scouting process.

**9 Michael Johnson - DE - Georgia Tech**

Quick junior pass rusher displays the burst off the edge to develop into a top NFL sack artist. He can be a consistent outside rusher with the growth potential to become a top flight pro.

**10. \* Knowshon Moreno - RB - Georgia**

Quick underclassman combines top running skills of quickness, power, vision and balance with the speed to break a big play. He also shows fine hands as a receiver.

**11. \* Tim Tebow - QB - Florida**

Smart junior QB combines all the physical skills and intangibles to become a top flight pro starter. He faces a key decision this January about declaring for the NFL Draft.

**12. Rey Mauluga - LB - Southern Cal**

Powerful inside backer has had a dominant senior performance, showing sideline to sideline playmaking ability.

**13. \* Chris Wells - RB - Ohio St**

Strong tailback has the speed, strength and quickness to run both inside and outside with the burst to make the big play.

**14. \* Percy Harvin - WR - Florida**

Fast junior receiver has been an impact performer for the Gators since his freshman season and is ready to join the pro ranks in April.

**15. Aaron Curry - LB - Wake Forest**

Mobile senior linebacker combines the complete package of speed, instincts, quickness and power to be an early NFL starter.

**16. \* Vontae Davis - CB - Illinois**

Talented junior corner has top athletic ability including the speed, quickness, instincts and quick reactions to develop into a top flight pro. He has had only a good '08 season.

**17. Clint Sintim - LB - Virginia**

Big mobile senior backer is well developed to be an early NFL starter where he is ideally suited for the 3-4 scheme.

**18. Malcolm Jenkins - CB - Ohio St**

Physical senior corner combines the size, speed and experience to play any coverage scheme showing the instincts, range and ball skills to be an early pro starter.

**19. \* Jermaine Gresham - TE - Oklahoma**

Fast junior pass catching tight end has the burst of speed and the run after the catch ability to be a difference maker in a pro passing attack.

**20. William Moore - FS - Missouri**

Physical senior safety has the instincts, athletic package and playing experience to be an early pro starter at either deep position.

**21. James Laurinaitis - LB - Ohio St**

Athletic senior linebacker combines a fine level of development with the physical skills and the intangibles to start early as a pro in both NFL defensive systems.

**22. Alphonso Smith - CB - Wake Forest**

Savvy short corner shows well developed skills for the position combining instincts, speed, quickness and intangibles to warrant an early NFL starting grade.

**23. Jason Smith - OT - Baylor**

Big mobile left tackle shows top athleticism, footwork, technique and body control for the lines most demanding position.

**24. Brian Cushing - LB - Southern Cal**

Athletic senior backer has performed very well over his long Trojan career, showing a high level of development to start as a pro rookie.

**25. \* Captain Munnerlyn - CB - South Carolina**

Speedy short junior corner has developed well in the tough SEC and has the upside potential to get better with further playing experience.

**26. \* LeSean McCoy - RB - Pittsburgh**

Shifty junior tailback displays natural running skills using his strong compact frame with excellent body control and the combination of quick feet and strength to run inside and outside.

**29. \* George Selvie - DE - South Florida**

Fast junior pass rusher shows a burst from the outside relying on good quickness, speed and technique to beat tackles on the snap. He has had only a good '08 season after an impact '07 effort.

**30. \* Darrius Heyward-Bey - WR - Maryland**

Big fast junior receiver combines all the skills to become a top flight pro and an early selection in April.

**31. \* DeMarco Murray - RB - Oklahoma**

Explosive junior tailback displays game changing ability as a runner, receiver and returner.

**32. \* Peria Jerry - DT - Mississippi**

Mobile huge tackle combines the bulk, mobility and quickness to create havoc from the inside.

**33. Duke Robinson - OG - Oklahoma**

Wide body senior guard combines mobility, bulk, footwork and speed to perform all the duties with quickness, power and athleticism.

Mobile senior tight end displays highly developed receiving skills with improving blocking ability.

Athletic junior safety is a versatile defender with the ability and speed to matchup in coverage and supports the run.

**52. \* Ciron Black - OT - LSU**

Huge junior tackle moves well within the box with the power to drive defenders off the line and the quickness to trap, in addition to anchor in pass protection.

**53. Louis Murphy - WR - Florida**

Big fast wideout has the talent to be a fine NFL receiver especially as a vertical threat with further development of coverage.

**54. Tyson Jackson - DE - LSU**

Strong senior end has the package to be an every down end in either scheme with more consistency. He needs a strong postseason to move up the charts.

**55. Phil Loadholt - OT - Oklahoma**

Huge mobile left tackle shows the combination of power and athleticism to man the outside position with some refinement and more consistency.

**56. \* Kenny Britt - WR - Rutgers**

Athletic junior receiver has been a fine playmaker in this passing game and has come on strong over the late '08 season that probably helps him decide to turn pro in January.

**57. Jamon Meredith - OT - South Carolina**

Mobile left tackle shows good bulk and footwork to protect vs speed rushers and the ability to get a push at the LOS.

**58. \* Jared Cook - TE - South Carolina**

Fast junior tight end has well developed receiving skills to be a fine addition to a pro offense.

**59. Jonathan Luigs - OC - Arkansas**

Rugged senior pivotman has graded out high over his entire NFL career.

**60. Evander 'Ziggy' Hood - DT - Missouri**

Quick senior tackle has been a force over his career, showing the ability to defend the run and rush the passer.

**61. \* Dennis Pitta - TE - BYU**

Mobile junior tight end is a sure handed fluid receiver who has been highly productive over his MWC career.

**62. Tyrone McKenzie - LB - South Florida**

Instinctive senior defender has the burst of speed to get to the ball at the sidelines or downfield.

Mobile outside linebacker has graded out well over his Big Te career in all aspects of play that gives him an early NFL starting grade.

**70. Max Unger - OL - Oregon**

Huge versatile physical blocker has played every line positions that will warrant an early starting pro grade and make him a hot commodity in April.

**71. Clay Matthews, 6-3, 240, Southern California**

Quick senior defender shows explosiveness on the outside that has him one of the fastest rising prospects in this class.
