NFL Draft 2010 Buzz

QB Sam Bradford - Oklahoma



Over the early '09 season schedule, many pro prospects have stepped up to improve their NFL potential. Several prospects have sustained injuries this fall that leave their playing and NFL Draft status up in the air over the second half of the schedule. **Oklahoma's QB Sam Bradford** has injured his shoulder twice this fall that currently has him on the sidelines for the rest of the season. Bradford underwent a shoulder operation in late October that will demand at least a 4 month rehabilitation and possibly 6 months. Bradford has a live arm with good touch, accuracy and decision making that could earn him the #1 overall selection in April. He will wait to see what his rehab will demand from a time perspective and when he can workout for scouts before deciding on turning pro. He will miss all games this season in addition to the NFL Combine. He has until mid Jan 2010 to declare and will wait to get all pertinent information before deciding. He hopes to workout in March/April for scouts if he declares and his rehab goes as scheduled. QBs **Tim Tebow of Florida, Colt McCoy of Texas and Tony Pike of Cincinnati** head a good senior QB class. Tebow has Florida #1 overall at midseason, but there is a wide range of opinions on his pro potential. He has returned from a serious

concussion and shown good accuracy and sound decision making that helps his cause. His All-star performance especially his practices at either the Senior Bowl or East-West Shrine game will go a long ways in determining his final draft status. McCoy is having a good season, though not as dominant as his '08 performance. He will have to have a strong finish and All-star week to retain a high draft status. Pike was the hottest QB in this class and a surprise to emerge this year after backing up most of his career. He sustained a broken left arm at midseason that will cost him several starts, but most likely allow him to return by mid November. He may be the fastest rising prospect in this draft class and one who earned invites from both major All-star events. A few of the junior passers like **Jimmy Clausen of Notre Dame** and **Jevan Snead of Ole Miss** are blue chip prospects, though each would benefit from another season of development. **QB Tim Haller of Western Michigan** has established himself as a solid NFL prospect with the physical tools scouts seek in a pro passer. He gets the ball down the field with velocity and accuracy and when protected he has been a very productive leader. His stock could rise further with a strong performance at one of the major All-star games.



RB Noel Devine of West Virginia has performed very well for this offense in several roles. He is a versatile back with speed and quickness to get outside and make the big play. He catches the ball very well and is a top kickoff returner and has been a difference maker in almost every contest. **RB C.J. Spiller of Clemson** has been an impact player as both a runner and returner. He has improved his stock nicely over the first half of the season with many big plays over 50 yards and one of the most dangerous playmakers in this draft class. **RB Stafon Johnson of Southern Cal** had a freakish weight lifting injury that has him on the sidelines. Johnson was a potential middle round selection

who was doing bench presses when he apparently lost control of the bar and it landed on his neck resulting in a serious neck injury including his larynx. All indications are that Johnson is unlikely to play again this season, but that the injuries are not life or career threatening and hopefully will be back with USC next spring/summer/fall. **RB LeGarrette Blount of Oregon** is currently sitting out after an early season suspension for a post game altercation. Blount's postgame action landed him a season long suspension that is being challenged currently. He could return for the final month of his senior season and possibly early November. He is a huge powerfully built inside runner whose strength and quickness translates well to the field. He hopes to recover from his action and show his skills in competition. He also looks to perform in the postseason especially the NFL Combine. **RB Charles Scott of LSU** is a tough physical runner with both power and quickness to run effectively between the tackles. He has early NFL starting talent and has shown nice development as a receiver. **RB Javarris James of Miami** is having a strong breakout performance in his final season. He is quick to the hole and has natural cutting skills that allow him to retain his good speed well and get to the second level. **RB Ben Tate of Auburn** is a strong senior tailback who hits the hole with authority and finishes each carry well. He lacks top speed and needs some development as a receiver but he is an honest runner who gets the most out of each rushing attempt. **RB Ryan Mathews of Fresno St** has performed well despite marginal talent on the Bulldogs offense. He is a tough runner who finishes well and shows natural ability to take his game to the next level.



(Photo) Wideout Dez Bryant of Oklahoma St was suspended for the remainder of the '09 season due to a NCAA violation that involved former NFL player Deion Sanders. Bryant was suspended in early October and a final decision in late October verified a season ending violation. He can be reinstated for the 2010 season which would be his senior year, though he will most likely declare for the NFL Draft this January. Oklahoma St officials that we spoke to stated, "Dez would be welcome back with the Cowboys if he retains his status with the school. We hope he continues his Cowboy career and joins us for spring practice in 2010." Bryant is a big receiver with good hands and surprising quickness to get open consistently. He is a difficult matchup due to size and overall strength. He projects to a mid first round grade currently, though his postseason workout will be vital to retain that ranking. **WR Jordan Shipley of Texas** has been one of the premier playmakers in the Big 12 this fall. He has good size and speed and has shown the run after the catch ability to be an early contributor in a pro offense as both a receiver and return specialist. He hopes to land a Senior Bowl invite. **WR Brandon LaFell of LSU** is a big strong receiver receiver who is quick in and out of his breaks and deceptive speed to get deep. He looks to shine in the postseason working with NFL caliber QBs

after dealing with inexperienced Tlger passers over his late career. **WR Eric Decker of Minnesota** was having a very good final season with several huge games and weekly big plays before a season ending injury. He is good out of breaks to get open consistently and he has the ability to go up in a crowd and make the tough catch. He has been tough in the red zone and has excellent that has enabled him to be one of the better playmakers in the Big Ten. **WR Mardy Gilyard of Cincinnati** has been one of the premier playmakers in the Big East this fall working with emerging QB Tony Pike. He has good size and speed and has shown the run after the catch ability to be an early contributor in a pro offense. His excellent hands and route running rank him right at the top of this senior receiving class He will receive a Senior Bowl invite. **WR Blair White of Michigan St.** has impressed again this fall and has an interesting skill set. He combines fine size and hands with adequate speed. to be a factor in the Red zone with the makeup to be a fine possession type pro starter. **WR Dexter McCluster of Ole Miss** has made a huge impact on the Mississippi offense and return game. He combines nice speed and quickness and with AA and the natural running skills to be dangerous every time he touches the ball. He looks to impress in the postseason that could move him into the early rounds. **WR Jacoby Ford of Clemson** is an intriguing prospect with the overall talent and level of development to help a pro offense early in his career. His fine speed, hands and run after the catch ability has impressed NFL scouts. **WR Naaman Roosevelt of Buffalo** has developed nicely over his senior season and is rising up the positional charts off his playmaking ability and natural running skills. His return skills also help his cause. **WR Arrelious Benn of Illinois** is one of the highly regarded underclassmen receivers, though he is not having a very productive season. He gets open and catches the ball fairly well with impressive run after the catch ability that has drawn notice since his freshman year. **WR Andre Roberts of Citadel** is a very good athlete who can help a club as a receiver and returner. He has adequate size with good speed and fine run after the catch ability will allow him to help in multiple passing sets as well as the return game. **WR Eric Decker of Minnesota** was having a huge final season when he sustained a knee injury that ended his career. He has great hands and runs precise routes that enables him to get open consistently. He has decent speed but has all the qualities of a fine NFL possession receiver.

Senior **TE Jermaine Gresham of Oklahoma** has missed the entire season and will not petition the NCAA to return for another year. He is rehabbing ACL surgery for his knee injury and hopes to be a full speed for both the NFL Combine and individual workout. He is a fine receiver with the legitimate deep speed to stretch the field. **TE Dennis Pitta of BYU** is having another fine season. He is a well developed receiver who will help immediately in a pro passing game. Junior **TE Rob Gronkowski of Arizona** is out with a knee injury that ended his season. He is a huge fluid athlete who catches the ball nicely and shows run after the catch ability plus the speed to get deep and power to be a strong inline blocker. He faces a huge decision in January related to turning pro. He is a blue chip prospect who must check out medically to earn a high grade. **TE Anthony McCoy of Southern Cal** is a big mobile receiver who catches the ball very well and has a keen understanding of coverage to be a major factor in a pro passing game. He is flying up the pro charts entering the close of the season. **TE Ed Dickson of Oregon** has outstanding movement skills that are more similar to a wide receiver than a tight end. He forces many mismatches in coverage. He has shown improvement as a blocker especially as an inline performer. **TE Garrett Graham of Wisconsin** has been a key two way performer in the Badgers offense, showing fine receiving skills in the passing game. He has very good hands and a keen understanding of openings in zone coverage.

OT Bryan Bulaga of Iowa is having a fine season after missing several early games due to a thyroid problem. He carries a first round grade if he is healthy and decides to declare after his junior season. He is a very physical blocker with good footwork and technique. **OT Anthony Davis of Rutgers** is another highly rated junior tackle who is having a strong '09 season. He has imposing size and agility and is gaining valuable experience at the demanding left tackle spot this fall. **OT Ciron Black of LSU** carries a first round grade at this point. Whether he projects to left or right tackle will probably be answered at a major All-star game like the East-West or Senior Bowl practices. **OT Russell Okung of Oklahoma St** is a mobile left tackle with very good footwork and reach that ranks him at the top of te class. He needs to show his skill set of footwork and technique at practices at a major All-star week to warrant a selection in the early part of the first round. **OT Trent Williams of Oklahoma** has had periods of inconsistent play that leaves some key questions about his level of play for the NFL game. He grades out high in run blocking, but erratic in other areas especially pass protection. He needs to impress in key ate season and postseason games to earn a #1 draft selection. **Guard Mike Johnson of Alabama** has graded out consistently high in the physical SEC. He can anchor well in pass protection with quick strong hands to control an opponent. He is a powerful drive blocker who has been instrumental in runner Mark Ingram's success this fall. He plays at a high level of development that scouts seek in a prospect.



DE Jerry Hughes of Texas Christian has been a dominant defender over the first half of the season. He is an explosive edge rusher with a quick burst to beat tackles from the outside. He is a defender who has beaten single blocking consistently and a player offenses have had to scheme to defend especially on passing situations. He has 9 sacks at midseason despite special attention often. He has risen up the charts as fast as anyone in this class. **DE/ LB Eric Norwood of South Carolina** has been one of the impact defenders in this draft class. He has a fast burst off the edge that allows him to gain a fast advantage as a pass rusher with the technique to win on

secondary moves. He will get a chance to impress vs top competition in the postseason with him high on the Senior Bowl invite list. **DE Willie Young of North Carolina St** is an athletic defender with intriguing upside potential as a pass rusher. He has improved with playing experience and shows some natural skills to rush the passer. He needs his position defined, but he fits both pro schemes. **DE Lindsey Witten of UConn** has been one of the fast rising defenders in this class. He has the burst off the edge that allows him to gain a fast advantage as a pass rusher. He hopes to get a chance to impress vs top competition in the postseason. **DE Brandon Lang of Troy** is a rangy defender with intriguing upside potential. He has the burst of speed off the edge to rush the passer and will command a lot of attention this postseason. **DE Brandon Graham of Michigan** is having a strong final campaign. He combines the burst of the edge with fine power and technique to make plays. **DE Greg Hardy of Ole Miss** has been a force this fall despite playing through persistent leg and foot injuries. **DT Terrance Cody of Alabama** has been a dominant defender at times over the first half. He is a huge powerful quick defender who beats single blocking consistently and gets a strong push in the middle that collapses the pocket. **DT D'Anthony Smith of Louisiana Tech** hopes to continue his strong final season with a postseason All-st week. He has nice physical skills with both quickness and power that has drawn heavy attention by NFL scouts. continues to be inconsistent in his play. **DT Arthur Jones of Syracuse** is a mobile defender who has graded out very high over his final season. He is quick on the snap that gains a fast advantage and he has the foot speed to close to the passer or runner on the perimeter. He was on our Senior Bowl invite list earlier in the season.



LB Brandon Spikes of Florida (Photo) has been the leader of the highly rated Gator defense. He moves very well and diagnoses the play quickly with the burst to get to the ball and finish with strong tackling. He is the ideal run and chase defender with sideline to sideline speed. **LB Daryl Washington of Texas Christian** has been the unsung performer on the Horned Frogs defense. He is a savvy tough backer with good speed and sound tackling ability to make plays. He has also shown leadership ability on a veteran unit. **LB Rolando McLain of Alabama** has been one of the premier players in the SEC again this season. He is a very physical defender with fine speed, quickness and tackling ability to be a difference maker weekly. He faces a key decision to turn pro this January. **LB Sean Weatherspoon of Missouri** has been one of the most complete defenders in the Big 12 this fall. He fills the hole with quickness and power and has the speed to make plays on the perimeter. He is high on the Senior Bowl list of

invitees. **LB Sergio Kindle of Texas** has been the leader on the tough Longhorn defense. He has superb instincts and combines quickness, power and sound tackling to be a sideline to sideline performer. **CB Chris Chancellor of Clemson** has made big plays often this season in coverage. He is a gambling athlete who can jump routes and make plays on the ball relying on his fine speed and quickness, though he can get caught out of position at times. **CB Joe Haden of Florida** is one of the fastest rising prospects in the nation. He has fine triangle numbers and improved in the finer points of the position with each game experience. He could be one of the elite defenders in this class if he declares which is expected. **CB Trevard Lindley of Kentucky** was having a strong senior season when he injured a knee that ended his Wildcat career. He faces some big medical tests over the postseason if he wants to carry an early

grade for April. **CB A.J Wallace of Penn St** has risen up scouts' rankings quickly this fall. He shows nice technique and good zone coverage skills that will warrant a long look through the spring. **CB Javier Arenas of Alabama** is a very quick cover man who can ride a receivers hip and cover in the deep game. He tackles and runs well with the ability to play both man and zone coverage to rank among the top prospects at the position. **CB Syd'Quan Thompson of Cal** is a fast smallish cover man with extensive experience vs top competition. He has improved fast in all areas of play and could be a first year NFL starter in the right setting. **Safety Taylor Mays of Southern Cal** a top flight athlete who is having an erratic final season. He was considered a Top ten prospect off his big play ability that he flashed weekly as an underclassman. His development has regressed this fall especially in his tackling and pass coverage ability. He needs a strong finish and postseason to return to the top of the class. **FS Nate Allen of South Florida** was instrumental in the USF rise in the Big East. He moves very well that combined with top instincts and toughness that him to play any position in the secondary. He matches up fairly well in pass coverage in both man and zone responsibilities. He will also come up and support the run with strong sure tackling to finish the play. **Safety Darrell Stuckey of Kansas** is having a fine senior season. He is an 'In the Box" safety to hits and tackles well. He is capable of matching up with fast tight ends. **Safety T.J Ward of Oregon** has been a key consistent performer this fall for the Ducks. He moves well and shows good ball instincts in coverage. **Safety Kam Chancellor of Virginia Tech** is a quick tweener backer/safety who moves well, reads plays good and finishes with sure tackling. He should test out well in all areas. **Safety Jordan Lake of Baylor** is a big hitter who has been inconsistent in pass coverage. He needs to impress in the postseason in zone situations to warrant an NFL grade.
